The cocktail, which followed, presented an excellent networking opportunity, which was enjoyed by members and guests.

In April, we returned to a format familiar to our long-standing members; a topical presentation by a technical expert followed by informal conversation over drinks and nibbles. The presentation was "Making air travel safer and faster" and the technical expert was Lionnel Wonneberger, Director Strategy & Business Development - Asia Pacific, Air Systems Division, Thales Australia.

In July, another technical function was organised jointly with Materials Australia and hosted by Prof. Milan Brandt at IRIS (Industrial Research Institute Swinburn). It took the form of a brief presentation, addressing the evolution of direct metal deposition (DMD), the current state of the art and various potential applications, followed by a demonstration of the process.

In conjunction with AFAS Victoria, FEAST-France awards up to three AFAS FEAST-France Fellowships each year to Victorian researchers wishing to undertake a study tour to France. These fellowships are granted as a complement to the Victoria Fellowships awarded by the Victorian Government. 2007 marked the 10th anniversary of the Victoria Prize and Fellowships, and the 4th presentation of the AFAS FEAST-France Fellowships.

This year the following candidates

were awarded a \$5000 grant:

- * Dr Bryony Coleman, Auditory neuroscience and stem cell biology;
- * Mr Simon Craig, Fluid Fertilisers;
- * Mr Andrew Walter, Spintronics and quantum computing.

We were sad to farewell Dominique de Gasquet, the Cultural & Scientific Attaché for Victoria, at an informal gathering of the committee at the home of Vice-President, Peter Tolé. We thank her for her support and encouragement and wish her well with her new appointment in New Delhi, India.

Our last function for 2007, "Nuclear Energy - why all the fuss?" was held at the Alliance Française in St Kilda, where AFAS-Vic members and guests gathered to hear the presentation by Dr Selena Ng, the Nuclear Business Development Manager from AREVA. After a welcome glass of bubbly, the President took the opportunity to introduce the newly arrived Cultural & Scientific Attaché in Melbourne, Sylvie Christophe and the new Director of the Alliance in Melbourne, Patrice Pauc.
